Context

As one of the most recently-formed Humanistic Management national Chapters (2018), we're keen to explore with others, in the spirit of this conference's theme of 'Solidarity and the Common Good', experiences of establishing a presence in our respective countries.

In our case, we came into being because we sensed that something needed to be done, but we weren't quite sure what. We're also keenly aware that we're at the early stages of our Chapter's life cycle, and still somewhere on the fringes of prevailing management thinking

and practices in the UK. this co-inquiry, we propose to make a virtue of our infancy by co-ordinating and facilitating an open exchange of notes with, and learning from, the experiences and wisdom of other national Chapters. And auite unashamedly, we're asking for your help! In return, we hope that this will be of mutual benefit - a form of collaborative learning that celebrates both our respective Chapters' diversity and what we have in common. We'll also look for ways to record and share the highlights of our conversations.

Who is invited?

Everyone is welcome to participate, including, of course, as many Chapter Leads as possible, as well as current or aspiring members of existing, new or prospective Chapters. The more, the merrier!

How might we work?

3.00-4.00 pm: Broadly, we expect that the first hour will be spent on

getting to know each other, and on surfacing an emergent agenda arising from the questions below.

4.00-5.00 pm: Sharing stories from Chapter Members from different

nations who are present, in a loosely-structured

format.

5.00-5.30 pm: Shaping future interactions and perhaps the germs of

a shared initiative, and closing with a brief review.

Information we could share with each other will emerge from the following questions amongst others:

- What were the key steps you took to develop the Chapter in the first three years?
- What challenges have you faced, and how have you addressed those?
- What initiatives and groups do you mostly get involved with?
- What are your key priorities from now on?

Preparation

There's no need to make any special preparations before participating in this gathering. Please just come along prepared to share and listen. If you are a Chapter leader (or feel able to speak on behalf of a Chapter) it would be good to have your contribution prompted by the previous questions.
